

Insults That Sound Like Compliments

- 100 backhanded compliments

Deliciously backhanded compliments: insults disguised as praise. They sound sweet, but sting once you process them.

1. **“You’re smarter than I thought you were!”**
→ Suggests you didn’t expect much intelligence in the first place.
 2. **“You look great... for your age.”**
→ Implies you’re old and not normally expected to look good.
 3. **“Wow, you actually pulled that off!”**
→ Suggests surprise at your ability.
 4. **“You’re braver than I’d ever be — I’d never leave the house looking like that.”**
→ Pretends to praise courage, really criticizes style.

Insults Disguised as Compliments

(Appear nice at first, but really criticize how someone looks)

Teacher's Tip for Students

Backhanded compliments are a form of **ironic politeness**. They use **positive words** like *brave, unique, natural, confident*, but add a twist that makes them sting.

They're useful in:

- **Comedy & satire** (British humor uses them a lot).
- **Polite insults** where direct rudeness would be too harsh.
- **Creative writing** to show sarcasm, rivalry, or disguised hostility.
